Dear Sir,

Year 1992 is being marked as the 500th anniversary of the arrival of Europeans in the American continent. It therefore seems a particularly appropriate time to highlight concerns with respect to unresolved human rights violations against indigenous people.

Indigenous people make up some six per cent of Chile's population. The largest of the several indigenous groups is the estimated 600,000 to one million Mapuche Indians who after the 1973 coup d'etat have been treated with extreme cruelty -many have been arrested, tortured, killed and "disappeared"-by the big landowners, the land barons, the military and the carabineros.

One example of such inhuman treatment is the extrajudicial execution of Nelson Wladimiro Curinir Lincoqueo in 1973 after he had been arrested by an armed group of men in air force uniform. After the restoration of democratic government in Chile in March 1990 his case was presented to a civilian court for investigation

I wish to welcome the still going on investigations into his killing and express the hope that the full truth will emerge and those responsible for his death will be brought to justice. believe that this must happen with respect to this and all human rights violations committed in Chile in order to prevent such attrocities from recurring. I believe however that the amnesty law of 1978 constitutes an obstacle to clarifying past abuses and preventing their recurrence and should therefore be repealed.
