I am deeply concerned that those guilty of the abuses against the Mapuche Indians are still not brought to justice, and I wish that the 1978 amnesty law will be withdrawn so that investigation may be conducted against those guilty of the abuses. This is an obligation to the families who have lost their loved ones, and the best way to prevent abuses in the future.
