Dear Sr. Patricio Aylwin,

I am writing to protest in the strongest possible terms about the decision of your Government apparently to provide a blanket immunity to all of those who committed crimes during the seventeen years of military dictatorship in Chile. I am disturbed that after such high hopes following the restoration of democracy a blanket immunity has been given covering not only minor crimes, which many of us might agree deserve immunity, but also major breeches of civil and human rights.


I am given to understand that a protest rally lead by former political prisoners was broken up by violent measures recently, I am also concerned to hear that the Association of Relatives of the Disappeared have started an indefinate hungar strike to draw attention to your decision to provide immunity. May I comment that this decision appears to be contradictory to the promises made by your government at the last General Election.

Finally could I ask that in order to restore Chiles good name in the international community you should honour the election promises and bring to justice those who committed the major crimes against the people during the sad years of military dictatorship.
