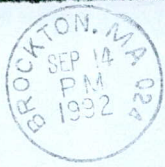
Your Excellency:

I congratulate you on your opposition to the death penalty. In light of this, I respectfully ask you to grant clemency and commute the death sentences of Quispe, Aguilar, and Morales. Amnesty International is opposed to the death penalty in all cases.

Hopefully, this can be the first step toward total abolition of capital punishment in Chile. Over 40% of all nations have already abolished capital punishment. Abolition ensures long-term respect for human rights, regardless of nationality. I beseech you to remember the human rights of Quispe, Aguilar, and Morales, and commute their death sentences. 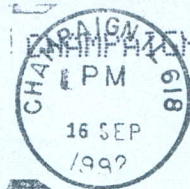

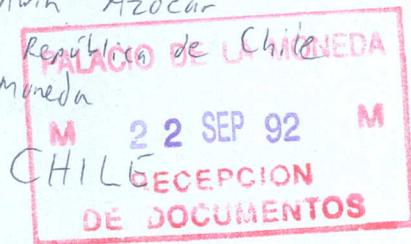
