Excelentísimo Señor Presidente

RE: EJECUCION EXTRAJUDICIAL DE NELSON VLADIMIR CURIÑIR LINCOQUEO.

Nelson Vladimír Curiñir Lincoqueo, estudiante y activista mapuche fue detenido por fuerzas de seguridad el 5 de octubre de 1973. Su desaparición de muchos años sólo pudo aclararse en Noviembre de 1990, cuando su familia ubicó e identificó su cuerpo y pudo finalmente darle sepultura. Nelson Curiñir es solamente uno de los numerosos mapuches asesinados cuyos asesinos continúan en la impunidad, protegidos por la Ley de Amnistía. Esta ley ha sido usada para cerrar sumarios en investigaciones de violaciones a los derechos humanos ocurridas con anterioridad a 1978, impidiendo que los hechos sean aclarados y las responsabilidades criminales establecidas.

En 1992, 500 años después de la llegada de los europeos a las Américas, queremos reafirmar nuestra esperanza que los derechos de los Pueblos Indígenas sean defendidos por todos los gobiernos. Respetuosamente le pedimos que derogue la Ley de Amnistía que sirve de obstáculo para aclarar estos abusos. Nosotros creemos que es muy importante que aquellas personas que todavía piensan que pueden cometer abusos contra los derechos humanos, reciban un claro mensaje diciéndoles que no podrán esconderse de la justicia, que el Estado no los protegerá y que estas violaciones no serán jamás toleradas por su gobierno.
