
Your Excellency:

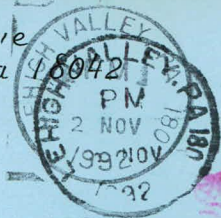
