Han, Sung-Joo (Ph.D., University of California-Berkeley) is a professor of political science at Korea University and was director of its Asiatic Research Center (1982-86). Dr. Han was also director of the Korean Association of International Relations (1980-81) and the Korean Political Science Association (1982-83). He was a visiting professor at Columbia University and Distinguished Fellow at the Rockefeller Brothers Fund (1986-87). Dr. Han is currently a member of the Executive Committee of International Political Science Association (IPSA). Professor Han is the editor or co-author of *Soviet Policy in Asia: Community-Building in the Pacific Region: Issues and Opportunities*; *After One Hundred Years: Continuity and Change in Korean-American Relations* (1982); *The U.S.-South Korean Alliance* (with Gerald L. Curtis, 1983); and *Foreign Policy of the Republic of Korea* (with Youngnok Koo, 1985). He has also presented numerous papers on Korean unification to international conferences.

Kim, Hong Nack (Ph.D., Georgetown University) is a professor of political science at West Virginia University. He was a visiting Fulbright Professor at Seoul National University (1990). Editor of *Asia Pacific Review*, he has written widely on East Asian affairs, contributing articles to such journals as *Asian Survey*, *Pacific Affairs*, *World Politics*, *Current History*, *Journal of Northeast Asian Studies*, *Keio Journal of Policies*, *Asia and Pacific Community*, and *Problems of Communism*. He is co-editor of *Inter-Korean Relations After the Seoul Olympics* (1988); *Perspectives on Inter-Korean Relations* (1987); and *Korean Reunification: New Perspectives and Approaches* (1984). He has also contributed a chapter to the U.S. Congress' Joint Economic Committee, entitled *China's Economy Looks Toward the Year 2000* (Washington, D.C.: U.S. GPO, 1986), Vol. 2.

Fitzpatrick, Mark T. (MPP, Harvard) is an American foreign service officer, currently serving as a first secretary in the political section of the American Embassy in Tokyo. He attended the Japanese National Institute for Defense Studies (1990-91). He previously served in the American Embassies in Seoul (1980-82) and Tokyo (1982-85) and in the Office of Korean Affairs in the Department of State (1988-90), where he dealt primarily with issues involving North Korea.
