Dear Mr. President,

I have learned of the extradition procedures against OSWALDO ROMO MENA, which should enable him to stand trial in your country on charges of serious human rights abuses during the military government.

May I respectfully urge that the case of ALFONSO CHANFREAU, at present being investigated by a civilian judge, Gloria Olivares, in which Oswaldo Romo Mena is believed implicated, is not handed over to the Military Court. May I ask that this, and other cases of human rights violations including disappearances, be dealt with by civilian courts.

May I respectfully urge that the Amnesty Law of 1978 be finally repealed, allowing proper investigations into disappearances and the prosecutions of military personnel involved. May I point out that the cases of disappearances are "continuing crimes" and remain so until those who have disappeared are either found alive or their remains are established.
