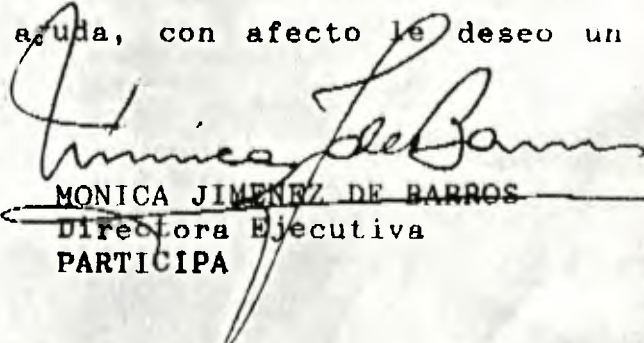

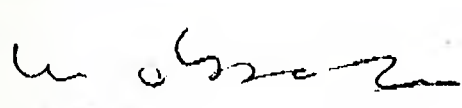

Robert N. Burt is chairman, president and chief executive officer of FMC Corporation.

He was elected to FMC's board of directors in 1989, became president of the corporation in March 1990, and was appointed chairman and chief executive officer effective Nov. 1, 1991.

Burt joined FMC in 1973 as director, corporate planning. He was named director, finance and business development, of the Agricultural Chemical Division in 1976. When the company was organized into nine operating groups in 1977, he was appointed manager of the Agricultural Chemical Group. He was elected a vice president of FMC in 1978 and subsequently served as group manager of the company's Defense Systems Group from 1983 to September 1988, when he was named executive vice president of the corporation. From May 1989 to December 1991, he also served concurrently as chairman and chief executive officer of FMC Gold Company, of which FMC has a 79 percent stake.

Prior to joining FMC, Burt was with Chemetron Corporation where he began a corporate planning function and was president of an international division. From 1964 to 1968 he held various corporate, regional, and foreign affiliate planning positions with Mobil Oil Corporation. He also was a lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps from 1959 to 1962.

He received a bachelor of science degree in chemical engineering from Princeton University and a master of business administration degree from Harvard Business School.

Burt serves on the board of trustees of the Manufacturers Alliance for Productivity and Innovation. He is a member of the board of directors of the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago, chairman of the United Way/Crusade of Mercy's Major Employers Group, serves on the Visiting Committee of Northwestern University's College of Arts and Sciences, is a member of the Economic Club of Chicago and the Chicago Club.

He and his wife, Lynn, have three children and reside in Winnetka, Ill.

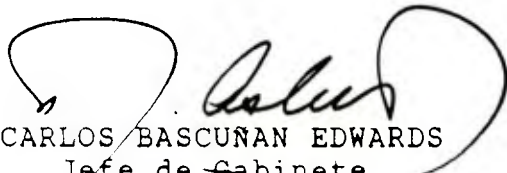

Dear President Aylwin:

During the last year we have watched your courage in leading the new democratic state of Chile. Your achievements are admired, and have created the greatest interest here. For this reason I am grateful and honored for this opportunity to invite you to come to Yale University as a Visiting Chubb Fellow. A visit by you would be greeted by the entire Yale community with tremendous warmth and enthusiasm.

The Chubb Fellowship is the highest honor Yale University confers upon visiting lecturers. The Fellowship introduces students to outstanding public figures and their thoughts; its aim is to encourage young men and women to pursue their own careers in public service. The Chubb Fellowship has been honored by the participation of a wide range of leaders including several Presidents of the United States and foreign heads of state. Some of those who have come to Yale have been: Presidents Truman, Ford, Carter, Reagan, Bush, Alfonsin; Prime Ministers Clement Attlee, Edward Heath and Mario Soares; Vice-Presidents Walter Mondale and Hubert Humphrey. More recent Chubb Fellows have included Reverend Jesse Jackson, Senator Edward Kennedy, Governor of Puerto Rico Rafael Hernandez Colon, and Latin-American novelist and then presidential candidate Mario Vargas Llosa of Peru. Last year the Chubb Fellowship has been honored with the visits of Chai Ling, Octavio Paz, and President Collor of Brazil. Please find enclosed the Chubb Fellowship booklet which provides background information and lists all past Visiting Chubb Fellows through 1989.

During your visit, you would be our honored guest at Timothy Dwight College, one of Yale's twelve undergraduate residences. Your visit would be tailored to the demands of your schedule. The usual length of stay is between one half and two days, but we would be happy to have you with us for as long or short a time as might be convenient for you. When you are with us the two major events will be a reception and banquet in your honor and a public address we will invite you to deliver to the entire Yale community and to utilize Yale as a platform to address all universities in the United States. A longer stay would involve meetings with groups of students and faculty on campus directly

involved with research on Chile. Of course, we would be delighted to arrange meetings at Yale with any groups or individuals whom you would like to see.

The Chubb Fellowship will provide travel arrangements. Your overnight accommodations will be in the Chubb Suite (Timothy Dwight College). We would also extend our invitation to Mrs. Aylwin whom we cordially invite to accompany you. If you travel with an aide, we will also provide travel and accommodations for him/her. In addition, we offer an honorarium of \$3,000.

Your visit could take place at any time over the next year, perhaps coordinated with your next visit to the United States. Yale is located one and one half hours north-east of New York City by car, and is two hours from Washington D.C. by air. Scheduling however, will have to be done within the confines of the academic calendar which runs September through May.

The opportunity to share your perspective and ideas on the role of political leaders of societies in a rapidly changing world would be invaluable. I sincerely hope that you will accept our invitation to come to Yale University and share your experience with us. Nowhere else would you receive a warmer welcome.

THE CHUBB FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM is devoted to encouraging and aiding students interested in the operations of government and in public service careers. The Program was established in 1936 through the generosity of **Hendon Chubb (Yale 1895S)**, who sought to "develop a more intelligent interest and understanding on the part of undergraduates . . . as to the way our government functions and the way in which they should discharge their responsibilities to it." The Program is based in **Timothy Dwight College** and directed by its **Master, Professor Robert Farris Thompson**, assisted by the **Associate Chubb Fellow, Rachelle Trerice**. Although the activities of the Program focus on the students at Timothy Dwight, one of Yale's undergraduate residential colleges, the impact is felt throughout the University, and in the community at large.

In 1949, the **Visiting Chubb Fellowship** was established as the principal means of achieving the goals advanced by Mr. Chubb. Since that time, four or five distinguished men and women have been appointed each year as Visiting Chubb Fellows, spending several days at Yale in close and informal contact with students.

Although the Fellows generally make a public address on a topic of special interest to them, the main purpose of their visit is to provide an opportunity for a relaxed exchange of ideas and for a probing of the Fellow's experience and perspectives on public issues and life. The format of a visit is flexible, but is directed at permitting the Fellow to meet with small groups of students over meals in Timothy Dwight's Dining Hall or in a College suite, at discussions in the Common Room, or over a seminar table.

During the period of his residence, the Fellow lives in the Chubb Fellow's Suite in the College and takes most of his meals with students. The Visiting Fellow generally meets with interested faculty as well, and takes part in several seminars or classes which are discussing topics related to his field of interest.

Over the years, the Program has been quite successful in bringing a wide variety of public leaders to Yale as Visiting Fellows. A large number of elected officials have been in residence, from President and Prime Minister to Mayor, as well as distinguished civil servants from the United States, other nations, and international organizations. A wide range of scholars, journalists and publicists have also served as Visiting Fellows. The response of the students has been uniformly enthusiastic. In an age of mass media, the Visiting Chubb Fellowship provides a unique opportunity for students and public figures to interact in a relaxed and personal atmosphere and to discuss not only significant national and international issues but also the pains and pleasures of public life.

The Associate Chubb Fellow lives in the College and assists the Master in the management of the Program.
