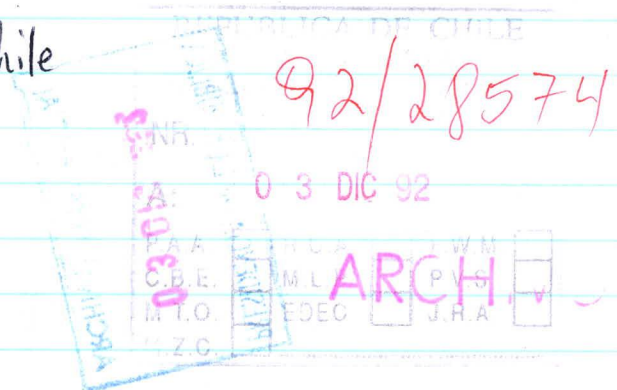

Sr. Patricio Aylwin Azocar:

I am a student attending Helix High School who is concerned with violations of human rights. I am aware of the execution of Nelson Wladimir Curinir Lincqueo in 1973, who was taken by heavily armed men in armed forces uniform. His family never saw him alive again.

Nelson was a student at the Technical University in Temuco and an activist in the Communist Party. In March 1990 a Machupe Indian came forward to say that his body had been found on the banks of the River Cautin in 1973. On January 5, 1991, Nelson Curinir's family buried him in the General Cemetery of Temuco. Those responsible for his killing have not been brought to justice.

I ask that the investigations into his killing be carried out and I hope that the full truth will emerge and those responsible for his death will be brought to justice.
